Meeting Summary:

Improving Austin Streams Implementation Plan Update

September 29, 2021, 10 a.m. to noon, via Zoon

Welcome, Introductions, Agenda Review and Updates

After a brief welcome, each participant introduced him/herself. Ms. Schwartz then reviewed the meeting agenda. No updates were suggested.

Consider Timeline for I-Plan Update

Participants discussed and modified the process and timeline for developing the I-Plan update. Specific changes included increasing the time to review and develop data and consider existing and new measures to include in the update. The group acknowledged that both the process chart and the timeline could be modified as the process moves forward, especially after data needs are reviewed (December 15, 2021). The revised process and timeline document will be posted on a new Resources webpage for the Improving Austin Steams I-Plan Update.

Consider proposed Stakeholder Group Guidelines, General Operations, and Coordination Committee Appointments

Working from a draft that was revised based on discussion at the August meeting, participants agreed to draft final guidelines. A copy will be posted in the Meeting Records section on the <u>Improving Austin Streams I-Plan Update webpage</u>. The following are key decisions:

- A Coordination Committee will be formed from members of the Stakeholder Committee, consisting of one representative of each of the following groups. The Coordination Committee may modify this list at any meeting. Each member may appoint an alternate, who will act in the representative's stead when they cannot attend a meeting.

 - Austin Water

 - o Travis County Transportation and Natural Resources

- The project facilitator or stakeholder group members will contact the following groups to determine whether they are willing to participate and their representatives will be added to the Coordination Committee if they are willing.
 - Keep Austin Beautiful
 - o People Organized in Defense of Earth and Her Resources
 - o Austin Sierra Club
 - Dog owner group
 - Austin Chamber of Commerce or other business interest
- The Coordination Committee will make decisions by consensus, with the ability to revert to a vote if needed.
 - An entity that would be implementing a decision must agree to that decision/management measure.
 - o If consensus is not reached, a minority report may be included in the record.
- Meetings of the Stakeholder Group and Coordination Committee are open to the public.
- A Data Work Group was formed to guide data review and collection. Initial participants are Yanjun Chu, Andrew Clamann, Tracy Janus, and Becca Oliver.
- A Planning Committee will assist the facilitator with meeting and process. Tammy West and Tejashri Kyle agreed to serve on that group.
- Draft goal: The group discussed a draft deadline of five years after plan adoption for meeting contact recreation use water quality standards (September 1, 2027) and determined to revisit this date during development of the updated I-Plan. They considered the five-year deadline both desirable and very ambitious. They considered the idea of using different deadlines for the different watersheds.

Identify Next Steps for Moving Forward

Louanne Jones described material now posted on the I-Plan Update webpage in the Meeting Records section related to Best Management Practices, watershed maps with a street overlay, and GIS layers. She indicated she would be setting up a separate webpage devoted to technical information and other resources the group may wish to reference throughout I-Plan development.

UT Austin reported that Professor Stuart Reichler and his students conducted sampling of Waller Creek this summer, which included analysis differentiating whether fecal contamination is from humans or animals. UT Austin stakeholder representatives will ask Dr, Reichler to present at a future meeting.

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Wrap-up, Review of Next Steps

The Coordination Committee will meet in mid-December. Suzanne Schwartz will circulate a Doodle poll to all members of the stakeholder group to determine availability. All stakeholders are welcome and encouraged to attend in addition to members of the Coordination Committee. The Data Work Group will present an initial report at the December meeting. Participants with Municipal Separate Storm Sewer (MS4) permits or authorizations are asked to perform a high-level review of their programs and their associated Stormwater Management Programs (SWMPs) to support the update.
